


IN LOVING MEMORY OF

Our dear dad (lover of obituaries and appreciator of funerals) is gone. At the time of his passing, dad was lovingly surrounded by family, who faithfully counted his breaths until they disappeared. In the same serene way dad lived, he slipped away in the afternoon of January 13th, 2026.

As "World's Greatest Dad" title holder (with the mug to prove it) he was gentle, loving, strong, and kind. Dad possessed an endless supply of patience, quarters, and gum. He instilled in all six of his girls a deep love for Cape Breton music and heritage, always reminding us to honour those who had come and gone before us. He was handsome and funny, and called anyone he had ever met (in person or not) a friend. No stranger to hard work, dad provided well for his family without complaint about how tired he must have been, coming home instead with a smile and willingness to spend time with his enthusiastic girls. There are so many things we could say about how wonderful dad was, but the thing freshest in our minds now is how beautifully he embodied suffering well over the past few years. While communication was very difficult of late, we never once had to wonder if dad loved or was proud of us. He'd shown consistently over the years that he adored his family.

Left to mourn are his beloved wife of 59 years, Muriel (Etheridge) Ross, who cared so selflessly and tenderly for dad during his battles with cancer and Parkinsons; his sister Anne (Irving) Deale, his brother Sandy (Josephine), daughters Laurie (Lloyd) Skinner, Suzanne (Ian) White, Tracey (Hugh) Morrison, Allison (Jason) Swan, Barbara (Brandon) Nielsen, and Angela (Carey) Ross; grandchildren Charles, Jessica (Lee), Rebecca (Marcus), Caelan, Joey, Carey, Abigail (Ben), Timothy, Emma, Hannah, Alexander, Tucker, Avery, Audrey, James, Katie, and Ben, and great-grandchildren Ellen, Everest, Oliver, and Emily; and many nieces and nephews (especially Catherine and Kevin after the passing of their father). It goes without saying that the MacDougall Lake Ainslie crew, lifelong friends, regular caregivers, church family and colleagues amassed over the years are feeling this loss as well - you know who you are and we love you!

By God's grace, these were nailed to the Cross of Christ, in which dad trusted for this life and for the next. He is with Jesus, perfected and rejoicing. We will meet again, and while we're heartbroken, we are grateful for how evident God's faithfulness and guidance has been to all of us in this time, especially over the past month.
